DISCRIMINATION AND ARCHITECTURE IN THE 21TH CENTURY

The aim of the course is to discuss the role, limits, and possible contributions of architecture within the scope of social discrimination and design concerns, and to provide alternative architectural proposals to related discussions. To achieve this aim, it is asked from students to analyze the everyday life of society in their close settlements and to realize excluded communities and their spatial habits. Each student will work in their neighborhood and/or district. Within the direction of the analysis' findings, it is expected to organize an architectural program to provide design proposals with a pluralist approach. The program may have varied from community centers to pop-up spaces and such with relation to the concept and the target group. The total square meter must be between 3000 – 4000 m².

The course will be supported by theoretical readings, discussions, and workshops with the participation of invited scholars and discussants.
